Being an active member of the Student Painting Club, she used to lock herself in the basements of the university to focus on her passion in silence. As she claims, she is rarely satisfied with the results of her work for one hundred percent. She has been still waiting until she creates something extraordinary, which will give her full satisfaction. In 2017, she completed her post-graduate studies in the department of painting at Maria Curie-Skłodowska University in Lublin with a very good result.
